Dear Nursing/Midwifery / Children's and General Students

Welcome to the School of Nursing & Midwifery at Trinity College Dublin (TCD). We are delighted that you have been offered a place on one of the following Bachelor in Science (Nursing/Midwifery/ Children's and General Nursing) programmes. The course will begin on Monday 14th September 2026 as per your course timetable.

Important Next Steps:

1. Select Preferred Training Hospital/Service:

Shortly after the CAO reply date, you will receive a message in your in-tray via the Student Information System (SITS) accessed via my.tcd.ie You will be asked to select your preferred training hospital/service for the Bachelor in Science Nursing /Midwifery programmes.

2. Garda (Police) Vetting:

- Nursing/Midwifery/ Children's and General nursing students who have accepted an offer or are enrolled on programmes which contain clinical or other professional placements must comply with the Garda Vetting process. If, as a result of the outcome of the Garda vetting procedures, a student is deemed unsuitable to attend clinical or another professional placement, he/she will be required to withdraw from the course.
- Students who have resided outside Ireland for a consecutive period of 6 months or more will be required to provide police clearance documentation from the country in which they resided at the time of registration.
- Students offered a place in Nursing/Midwifery/ Children's and General programmes in Trinity will be informed when Garda vetting forms have been uploaded on the TCD website for completion. These completed forms must be returned to the Academic Registry as soon as possible to avoid any delay in commencing clinical placements.

*****Note: Students must engage with all aspects of the Garda vetting process at the earliest point as directed by the Academic Registry. Any delays will result in students not being permitted to commence clinical placements.*****

3. Registration:

- All Nursing/Midwifery/ Children's and General programme students must be registered with TCD before commencing clinical placements. Therefore, students must engage in the registration process at the earliest possible point.

4. NMBI (Nursing and Midwifery Board of Ireland):

- Nursing/Midwifery/ Children's and General programme students are required to register with NMBI within 30 days of commencing the programme. Registration with NMBI is a mandatory pre-requisite for all students to commence clinical placements.

- **NOTE:** All Nursing/Midwifery/ Children's and General programme students must be registered with NMBI before commencing clinical placements. You are advised to complete registration at the earliest possible point.

Financial supports available to Tallaght University Hospital nursing students

All nursing students attached to Tallaght University Hospital (TUH) can apply for a means-tested Bursary from the Adelaide Health Foundation (AHF).

AHF bursaries are designated as non-reckonable income for SUSI (i.e. not counted as income). This means that recipients who are also in receipt of social welfare benefits and/or SUSI grants can receive AHF bursary without impacting these supports.

AHF Bursary scheme will open in October 2026. Keep an eye out for information about it, and you will also be able to access the application form at www.adelaide.ie.

The Adelaide Health Foundation also supports nurses in their professional development and contributes to the development of nursing practice in TUH through an annual programme of scholarships open to both nursing staff and students.
