USING THE LIBRARY

POSTGRADUATE BORROWING

Higher Degree

(Research/Taught Masters/PhD)

- You can borrow up to **50 books** at any one time from the General Lending collection, which can include items from our open shelves or from storage.
- Items can be borrowed for 12 weeks and renewed **once for a further 12 weeks**, as long as nobody else has placed a recall on the item

FINDING A PRINT BOOK ON THE SHELF



Use Search Stella (our catalogue) to identify where your book is located

You can borrow 10 books at a time for up to 28 days (and renew online)

Codes (shelfmarks) are assigned to books to help you locate them on the shelves


The code is visible on a white shelf mark label attached to the cover of the book

90% of our collection is in storage (on and offsite) - request these items through *Stella Search* using *Click and Collect*

USING THE LIBRARY

REQUESTING AN ITEM HELD IN STORAGE

The Stella Search entry indicates if your book is held in storage:

- **Santry and External Store (generally next weekday)**
- Other materials must be requested using a call slip (ask at our service desks)
- All material can be requested to the reading room for consultation and most can be borrowed

E-BOOKS – UKeLD & REGULAR E-BOOKS

UK legislation means that the electronic versions of legal deposit material must be accessed at designated PCs in the Library

You can access the e-books we purchase (regular e-books) from anywhere

- ✓ CONTACT your Subject Librarian for expert searching advice
- ✓ ATTEND a Library HITS class and brush up on your research skills

- ✓ INSTALL Lean Library to find the full text of articles via Google or Google Scholar
- ✓ BORROW up to 50 books at a time
- ✓ REQUEST books from storage using the Click and Collect service in Stella Search
- ✓ USE the Self-Service Kiosks to borrow or return books
