

| Post Title: | The School of Social Work and Social Policy. Research Assistant Studentship – Early Medical Abortion Data Collection Project |
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| Post Duration & Start date: | July 2025 – August 2026 |
| Project Description: | Legal early medical abortion (EMA) was established in Ireland with the repeal of the Eighth Amendment and passage of the Health (Regulation of Termination of Pregnancy) Act. A grassroots effort of General Practitioners (GPs) and the School of Social Work and Social Policy has worked together to develop an EMA data monitoring system for abortions delivered by GPs in the Republic of Ireland. |
| | This project aims to capture abortion service delivery data in Ireland in a systematic and standardized way. The main outcome of this study is to provide continuous monitoring of safety, efficacy, and quality of the community-based early medical abortion service. |
| | This studentship will play a critical role in collecting, monitoring, cleaning, and fielding queries about the data. The position will require working with faculty and staff at Trinity College as well as GP stakeholders. |
| | This studentship requires that the successful applicant complete their dissertation using data collected from this project. Therefore, the directions in the student handbook re: selection of dissertation topic do not apply to this studentship position. |
| Principle duties and responsibilities: | Monitor Early Medical Abortion data system: Send reminder emails about monthly data submission Monthly, move data into data repository Clean data and enquire about any irregularities |
| | Manage new GP study participants: Ensure consent has been submitted Onboard new study participants per study protocol Answer queries from participants and potential participants Monitor study email account |
